Use of the double vowel in te reo Maaori at CM Health

CM Health services are located and delivered within the boundary of the Waikato-Tainui lwi; it is important that the organisation adheres to the language differences of this lwi area. This is why you will see certain words in the directory written with a double vowel instead of a macron such as whaanau instead of whānau (family), Taamaki instead of Tāmaki (Auckland), ngaa instead of ngā (all).

Location of Services

Services are available across the Counties Manukau Health population although some services may serve a defined location or discreet group within the population. Due to limited capacity to collect information, and an aim not to duplicate information, the services in this edition of the directory include: health, social and aligned general *well being services* available across Counties Manukau Health's four localities however some of the health services are signposted to the national information service on Healthpoint.
